Patrick Brady was associated with the sport of jousting for over fifty-five years. He won many awards during his long career from 1920 through the 1960's and helped to keep the sport alive during the depression years. He won the Marshall Hall Park Tournament several times – a tournament long considered one of the most coveted wins among Maryland jousters.

He also competed at a time when riders either rode their horses to a joust or drove them in buggies, unhitching them to ride in the tournament and then rode or drove them home again, sometimes distances of thirty miles or more.

Mr. Pat, as he was affectionately known to all, was the Dean of the Brady Family Riders. He taught his four nephews, Charles, Francis, John and Joe to joust and all of them developed into top-notch riders. The best of whom were Charles and Joe.
