¶Inducted into the Hall of Fame - 1991

Adam Seymour Fisher, deceased, formerly of the Moorefield Area of Hardy County, presented to be inducted in the Hall of Fame by the South Branch Valley Riders Association.

Adam Seymour Fisher began riding tournament in 1920 and rode in tournaments at Petersburg Gap, Caledonia Heights, Burlington, Oak Grove Park, Ed;s Park, Davis, Elkins, Thoms, among others. He won his share of events and placed in many others. Remember that back when Mr. Fisher rode tournament he had to ride his horse to the tournament, ride tournament, then ride home.

Adam Seymour Fisher is a brother to George Fisher, a charter member of the National Hall of Fame, and is an uncle to William N. Fisher, who is also being inducted in the Hall of Fame at this time, and is an uncle to Frederick Y. Fisher, who was inducted in the Hall of Fame in 1987. Mr. Adam Seymour Fisher in his Will left his title to his nephews, William N. Fisher or Frederick Y. Fisher, if either one desired to use same.
